8:00–9:00 a.m.	RETINAL IMAGING (1 IJCAHPO CE Credit) <i>Parampal Grewal, MD, FRCSC, ABO</i> This course will review principles of retinal imaging including OCT, OCT angiography, and fundus photography. It will provide an update on emerging imaging technologies including swept source OCT. Finally, it will discuss common retinal diseases and classification using retinal imaging and present interesting retina cases.
9:00–10:00 a.m.	INHERITED RETINAL DYSTROPHIES: A REVIEW OF DISEASE PRESENTATION, DIAGNOSTIC TESTING, AND CURRENT TREATMENT APPROACHES (1 IJCAHPO CE Credit) <i>Matthew Benson, MD, MSc, FRCSC</i> This 60-minute session will provide the audience with an overview of inherited retinal dystrophies including the disease presentation, diagnostic considerations, and current treatment approaches. Emphasis will be placed on the role of genetic testing and the utility of establishing a molecular diagnosis for the patient.

10:15–10:45 a.m.	TRIAGE IN A BUSY OPHTHALMOLOGY CLINIC (.5 IJCAHPO CE Credit) <i>Gillian Massicotte, COMT</i> This course will show how to streamline guidelines to help know when to book patients based on their symptoms.
10:45–11:15 a.m.	A DISCUSSION ON CLINIC EFFICIENCIES GAINED THROUGH THE PANDEMIC—THE NEXT NORMAL IN THE DESIGN OF THE OPHTHALMIC CLINIC ENVIRONMENT (.5 IJCAHPO CE Credit) <i>Aimee Mah, BSc, COT, MID</i> The clinical environment is an ever-changing entity where physicians, operation managers and staff are all searching for ways to improve efficiencies. Discussions to do so are often based on listing inefficiencies and trying to determine solutions. During the pandemic, similar to all aspects of our lives, innovation and creativity were required in order to survive and out of this, many efficiencies were created. This course will aim to shed light on some efficiencies developed during the pandemic in the ophthalmic setting and how this related to changes to the required physical space. This course will be an open discussion, where individuals will have an opportunity to share their own experiences of being a healthcare provider in the time of a pandemic and hopefully be able to celebrate their own triumphs during a challenging time.
11:15 a.m –12:15 p.m.	OCULAR BRACHYTHERAPY TREATMENT PLANNING (1 IJCAHPO CE Credit) <i>Matthew Larocque, Ph.D., FCCPM</i> This course will provide an introduction to ocular brachytherapy for treatment of uveal melanomas. Planning technique will be described in detail, including how various types of images (ultrasound, photography, CT, MRI) are used to build a model of the eye and tumor, with an overview of the pre-treatment workflow.

1:00–2:00 p.m.	EYELID AND ORBIT EXAM (1 IJCAHPO CE Credit) <i>Jaime Badilla, MD</i> This course will identify key points to exam in a patient with an eyelid or orbit complaint.

INTERESTING OPHTHALMIC ULTRASOUND CASES (.5 IJCAHPO CE Credit)

This course will go over what the eye looks like with different ultrasound approaches, including A-Scan, B-Scan and ultrasound biomicroscopy (UBM). Interesting cases will be shown, comparing classic A-Scans to abnormal A-Scans and B-Scan findings ranging from pseudophakia to optic nerve anomalies. UBM cases will include anterior segment pathology that could be oncology or non-oncology related.

ORIGINS OF EYE MOVEMENTS (.5 IJCAHPO CE Credit)

This course will discuss different classes of eye movements such as saccades, pursuit, and others. Introduction to eye movement pathways in the brain will be reviewed as well as cases of abnormal eye movements.

ULTRASOUND FOR THE DIABETIC PATIENT (.5 IJCAHPO CE Credit)

This course will explore ultrasonic techniques specific to ultrasonic findings in a diabetic patient. A review of general examination techniques will be covered, as well as techniques specific to diabetic retinopathy including examination of vitreous hemorrhage examination, retinal tear, and posterior hyphema.
